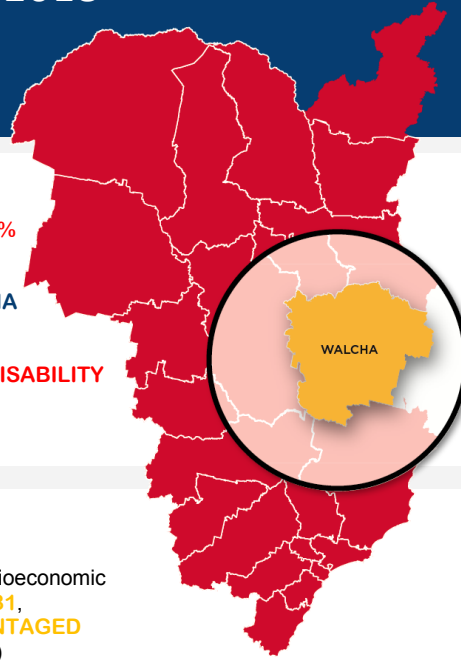
OUR PEOPLE



184 PEOPLE IDENTIFY AS ABORIGINAL AND TORRES STRAIT ISLANDER this is **5.9%** of the population (NSW 2.9%)

82.5% of the population was **BORN IN AUSTRALIA** (NSW 65.5%)

134 PEOPLE have a **PROFOUND OR SEVERE DISABILITY** this is **4.8%** of the population (NSW 5.6%)

SOCIAL AND ECONOMIC FACTORS IMPACTING HEALTH

The SEIFA Index of Relative Socioeconomic Disadvantage score is **981**, **WALCHA** is **MORE DISADVANTAGED** than **AUSTRALIA** (1000)

The **UNEMPLOYMENT RATE** in 2017 was **3.9%** (NSW 4.8%)



83.5% of **15 - 24 YEAR OLDS** were **EARNING OR LEARNING** in 2016 (NSW 85%)



The population will decline to approximately **2,600** in 2036

HEALTH RISKS

FOR EVERY 100 ADULTS IN 2014-15:



18.6 SMOKED (NSW 16)

23.5 consumed **ALCOHOL** at **HIGH RISK** (NSW 16.7)



35.8 were **OVERWEIGHT** (NSW 37.4) and another **37** were **OBESE** (NSW 28.2)

47.8 **ATE ENOUGH FRUIT** (NSW 49.2)



81.7 had **LOW OR NO EXERCISE** (NSW 67.1)

MUMS AND BUBS

The **TOTAL FERTILITY RATE** in 2013-15 was **2.7 BIRTHS PER WOMAN** (NSW 1.9)

18.7% of mothers **SMOKED IN PREGNANCY** in 2014-16 which was **SIGNIFICANTLY HIGHER** than the **NSW AVERAGE**

8.4% of babies born in 2012-14 were **LOW BIRTH-WEIGHT** (NSW 5.2%)

A **FIRST TRIMESTER ANTENATAL VISIT** occurred in **66.8%** of pregnancies in 2014-16 which was **SIMILAR TO** the **NSW AVERAGE**



17.2% of the population are aged **0-14 years** (NSW 18.5%)

25.8% of the population are aged **65 years +** (NSW 16.3%)

IMMUNISATION

WHO WAS FULLY IMMUNISED IN 2016-17?

94% of **1 YEAR OLDS** (Australia 93.8%)

93.1% of **2 YEAR OLDS** (Australia 90.9%)

94.1% of **5 YEAR OLDS** (Australia 93.5%)



MENTAL HEALTH

HIGH OR VERY HIGH PSYCHOLOGICAL DISTRESS was experienced by **7.1** of every 100 adults in 2014-15 (NSW 11)

CHRONIC MENTAL AND BEHAVIOURAL PROBLEMS were experienced by **12.1** of every 100 people in 2011-12 (NSW 13.1)

There were **6 HOSPITALISATIONS** for **INTENTIONAL SELF-HARM** in 2014-16 at a rate of **185.1** per 100,000 people which was **SIMILAR TO** the **NSW RATE**

1 PERSON DIED BY SUICIDE between 2000 and 2013

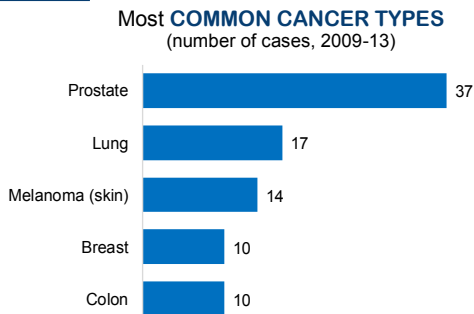

POTENTIALLY PREVENTABLE HOSPITALISATIONS

Between 2014 and 2016 there were **74.3 POTENTIALLY
PREVENTABLE HOSPITALISATIONS EACH YEAR**
at a rate of 2,412.6 per 100,000
This was **SIMILAR TO THE NSW RATE** (2,104.2)



ACCESS TO SERVICES

In 2014 **42 PEOPLE** experienced a **BARRIER TO HEALTH CARE ACCESS**
with **COST BEING THE MAIN REASON** at a rate of 2.0 per 100 people (NSW 2.5)

In 2014 **91 PEOPLE** experienced difficulty or
COULDN'T GET TO PLACES WITH TRANSPORT
at a rate of 3.6 per 100 people (NSW 4.3)



In 2016 **67.8% OF HOUSES** were able to **ACCESS THE INTERNET** (NSW 82.5%)

There are **2 GENERAL PRACTICES** in the area
and **FOR EVERY FULL-TIME GP THERE ARE 1,812 PEOPLE**



There is **1 PUBLIC HOSPITAL**



1,419 patients presented to the Walcha **EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT** in 2016-17,
1,182 were **SEMI OR NON-URGENT PRESENTATIONS**
and could have been managed in general practice
