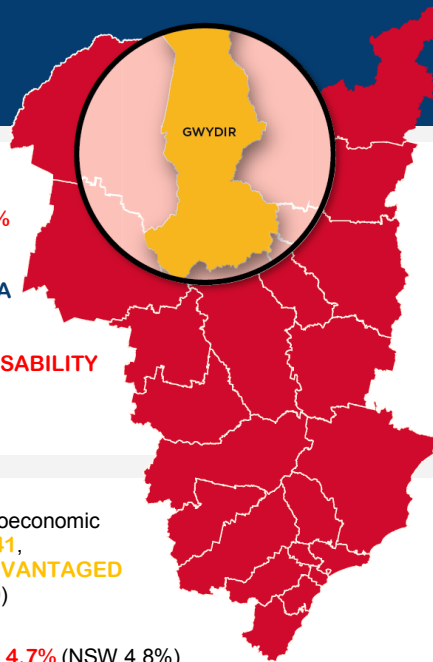
### OUR PEOPLE



**300 PEOPLE IDENTIFY AS ABORIGINAL AND TORRES STRAIT ISLANDER** this is **5.7%** of the population (NSW 2.9%)

**84.5%** of the population was **BORN IN AUSTRALIA** (NSW 65.5%)

**355 PEOPLE** have a **PROFOUND OR SEVERE DISABILITY** this is **7.5%** of the population (NSW 5.6%)

### SOCIAL AND ECONOMIC FACTORS IMPACTING HEALTH

The SEIFA Index of Relative Socioeconomic Disadvantage score is **941**, the **GWYDIR LGA** is **MORE DISADVANTAGED** than **AUSTRALIA** (1000)

The **UNEMPLOYMENT RATE** in 2017 was **4.7%** (NSW 4.8%)

**27.4 in 100** people had **GOVERNMENT SUPPORT AS THEIR MAIN SOURCE OF INCOME** for 13 months or more in 2013 and 2014 (NSW 20.4)



**78.1%** of **15 - 24 YEAR OLDS** were **EARNING OR LEARNING** in 2016 (NSW 85%)



The population will decline to approximately **4,000** in 2036

### HEALTH RISKS

FOR EVERY 100 ADULTS IN 2014-15:



**21.5 SMOKED** (NSW 16)

**21.8** consumed **ALCOHOL** at **HIGH RISK** (NSW 16.7)



**34.2** were **OVERWEIGHT** (NSW 37.4) and another **40.4** were **OBESE** (NSW 28.2)

**46.1** **ATE ENOUGH FRUIT** (NSW 49.2)



**79.9** had **LOW OR NO EXERCISE** (NSW 67.1)

### MUMS AND BUBS

The **TOTAL FERTILITY RATE** in 2013-15 was **2.8 BIRTHS PER WOMAN** (NSW 1.9)

**17.2%** of mothers **SMOKED IN PREGNANCY** in 2014-16 which was **SIGNIFICANTLY HIGHER** than the **NSW AVERAGE**

**3.3%** of babies born in 2012-14 were **LOW BIRTH-WEIGHT** (NSW 5.2%)

A **FIRST TRIMESTER ANTENATAL VISIT** occurred in **89.9%** of pregnancies in 2014-16 which was **SIGNIFICANTLY HIGHER** than the **NSW AVERAGE**



**18.5%** of the population are aged **0-14 years** (NSW 18.5%)

**26.1%** of the population are aged **65 years +** (NSW 16.3%)

### IMMUNISATION

WHO WAS FULLY IMMUNISED IN 2016-17?

**93.5%** of **1 YEAR OLDS** (Australia 93.8%)

**92.6%** of **2 YEAR OLDS** (Australia 90.9%)

**94.9%** of **5 YEAR OLDS** (Australia 93.5%)



### MENTAL HEALTH

**HIGH OR VERY HIGH PSYCHOLOGICAL DISTRESS** was experienced by **9.5** of every 100 adults in 2014-15 (NSW 11)

**CHRONIC MENTAL AND BEHAVIOURAL PROBLEMS** were experienced by **14.2** of every 100 people in 2011-12 (NSW 13.1)

There were **9 HOSPITALISATIONS** for **INTENTIONAL SELF-HARM** in 2014-16 at a rate of **171** per 100,000 people which was **SIMILAR TO** the **NSW RATE**



**3 PEOPLE DIED BY SUICIDE** between 2000 and 2013

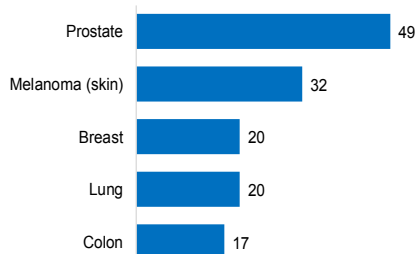
There is **1 person** per km<sup>2</sup> (NSW 10)

## CANCER INCIDENCE

**42 NEW CASES** of cancer were diagnosed in 2013

**CANCER INCIDENCE** in 2013 (598.7 per 100,000) was **HIGHER THAN THE NSW RATE** (500.5)

## CANCER MORTALITY

**13 PEOPLE DIED FROM CANCER** in 2013

The mortality rate (170.9 per 100,000) was **SIMILAR TO THE NSW RATE** (170)



## HPV VACCINATION

**99.4%** of teenaged **GIRLS** and **92.7%** of **BOYS** in 2016 were fully **VACCINATED AGAINST HPV** (NSW 82.5%, 69.9%)

## CANCER SCREENING PARTICIPATION 2015-16

There are **LOWER BREAST SCREENING** rates amongst **ABORIGINAL AND TORRES STRAIT ISLANDER** (42.2%) women

Breast Screening (NSW 53%) **70.8%** **204 WOMEN UNSCREENED**

Cervical Screening (NSW 56.3%) **62.0%** **454 WOMEN UNSCREENED**

Bowel Screening (NSW 37.8%) **42.1%** **226 PEOPLE UNSCREENED**

## POTENTIALLY PREVENTABLE HOSPITALISATIONS

Between 2014 and 2016 there were **141.3 POTENTIALLY PREVENTABLE HOSPITALISATIONS EACH YEAR** at a rate of 2,786.3 per 100,000. This was **SIGNIFICANTLY HIGHER THAN THE NSW RATE** (2,104.2)



## ACCESS TO SERVICES

In 2014 **66 PEOPLE** experienced a **BARRIER TO HEALTH CARE ACCESS** with **COST BEING THE MAIN REASON** at a rate of 2.0 per 100 people (NSW 2.5)



In 2014 **170 PEOPLE** experienced difficulty or **COULDN'T GET TO PLACES WITH TRANSPORT** at a rate of 4.1 per 100 people (NSW 4.3)



In 2016 **64.1% OF HOUSES** were able to **ACCESS THE INTERNET** (NSW 82.5%)

There are **2 GENERAL PRACTICES** in the area and **FOR EVERY FULL-TIME GP THERE ARE 1,878 PEOPLE**



There are **2 PUBLIC HOSPITALS**



**2,504** patients presented to the Bingara and Warialda **EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT** in 2016-17, **1,867** were **SEMI OR NON-URGENT PRESENTATIONS** and could have been managed in general practice
